Our week:

Owls - have been busy investigating seeds and planting our own 'magic beans', which we are very excited to watch grow. We have a huge beanstalk in Owl class and there has been lots of good storytelling in the Giants Kitchen role play area. We have made castles in our workshop area and created some very elaborate castle designs using loose parts. There has been lots more measuring, this time of feet and comparing sizes to the Giant's huge boots. We have read the story *Jasper's Beanstalk* and Snowy Owl's have made super cat puppets.

Moles - Moles have been learning about the life of Mary Anning, a famous fossil hunter. We have gathered information about her life and her most famous discovery - a fish-lizard! We have also made our own fossils ready to paint next week.

Kingfishers - There has been great excitement around the classroom this week, as we have started measuring the growth of our plants, with some observations not what we were expecting! Look out next week for our final results which we will share with you. Alongside this, we have started looking at artwork by Georgia O'Keeffe and produced some amazing sketches of sunflowers (examples above).

Kestrels - Kestrels have continued their topic on Yorkshire and made beautiful vignettes which are on display in the Hall. A fantastic well done to all our Year 6 pupils for their tremendous attitude towards their SATs this week. You were all truly amazing and did yourselves proud!
