



## Music Rationale

Music is important at Woodfield. All children participate in Music lessons with their class teacher, developing their musical knowledge, skills and understanding. There is an opportunity to be part of a school choir and we are developing opportunities to perform to a wider audience within the local community. Musical performances are actively encouraged, providing opportunities to promote individual talents and personal confidence.

### Intent

Our MFL curriculum is ambitious and accessible for all pupils.

- Pupils will perform, listen to, review and evaluate music across a range of genres.
- Pupils will learn about the works of the great composers and musicians.
- Pupils will create and compose music on their own and with others.
- Pupils will begin to learn how to play a musical instrument.
- Pupils will understand and explore how music is created.
- Pupils will begin to read music and notations.
- Pupils will demonstrate a knowledge and understanding of the RESPECT values within Music.

### Implementation

- Musical warmups (signing, clapping, repeating).
- Revisit prior musical knowledge/compositions.
- Sing/play back pieces of music.
- Experiment and compose own compositions.
- Play along to musical compositions (backing track or reading music).
- Collaborate to create and evaluate performances.

### Knowledge Points:

- Recall a piece of music.
- Play and perform in solo.
- Read and play a short piece of music.
- Create own compositions.
- Evaluate others and own compositions/performances.

### Assessment:

Pupils are required to recall and remember key facts and Musical knowledge and skills that they have learnt across a unit of work. Assessment will be built into each unit of work so that pupils are knowing more, learning more and remembering more.
