



PSHE Rationale

At Woodfield, we follow the PSHE Curriculum set by the CORAM Life Education. The curriculum is a question-based curriculum that is based around six key themes, which are:

- Me and My Relationships
- Valuing Difference
- Keeping Myself Safe
- Rights and Responsibilities
- Being My Best
- Growing and Changing

Intent

Our PSHE curriculum is ambitious and accessible for all pupils.

- Pupils will develop the knowledge and skills as well as the values of citizenship in order to keep themselves healthy and safe as they prepare for life and work in modern Britain.
- Pupils will learn how to develop and maintain healthy relationships.
- Pupils will learn about a wide range of rights and responsibilities and to understand that actions have consequences and their actions may adversely affect others.
- Pupils will demonstrate a knowledge and understanding of the RESPECT values within PSHE.

Implementation

- Discussion where all viewpoints are met with respect.
- The appreciation of difference and diversity.
- Recognise and apply the British Values of Democracy, Tolerance and Mutual Respect.
- Understanding and managing emotions.

Each unit will focus on teaching relevant knowledge from each period/civilisation.

Knowledge Points:

- All knowledge points are covered within units.

Assessment:

Pupils are required to recall and remember key facts and PSHE knowledge and skills that they have learnt across a unit of work. Assessment will be built into each unit of work so that pupils are knowing more, learning more and remembering more.

Assessments that will take place are:

Prior knowledge assessment

- Low-stakes quizzes.
- Starters referring to prior knowledge.
- Outcomes tailored specifically towards key knowledge – Use of software to produce a piece of work/project.
- End of unit assessment/quiz.
